

YHA Snowdon Ranger – Access Statement

Introduction

Offering a relaxed and comfortable stay nestled at the foot of Yr Wyddfa (Snowdon), this rural retreat in the mountains is located near the village of Beddgelert, Sygun Copper Mine, Caernarfon Castle and the Welsh Highland Railway.

The hostel is a three-storey building located on the western side of Yr Wyddfa (Snowdon) in Eryri (Snowdonia) National Park. Unfortunately, none of our bedrooms or bathrooms currently meet modern accessibility standards.

This access statement was last updated in January 2025.

Pre-arrival

- The nearest rail station is Bangor, 16 miles away.
- The nearest bus stop is within 150m of the hostel. This offers a limited service which usually runs accessible buses.
- Local taxi companies can provide accessible taxis when booked in advance.
- From the bus stop the road to the hostel is level and evenly surfaced with tarmac. However, there is no pavement or streetlighting.

Car parking and arrival

The hostel is located on the roadside. There is space for 8 cars to park in the layby opposite the hostel. There are no marked bays, but we are happy to reserve a space if needed. The layby is level and evenly surfaced with tarmac. From here guests must cross a busy road (60mph speed limit) to reach the hostel.

Guests can be dropped off outside the main entrance. There is further pay and display parking 50m away. If you let us know what time you are coming, we will do our best to assist you with moving to and from cars.

Main entrance and reception

From the forecourt there is a small 5cm step up onto the tiled porch, followed by a level threshold through a single leaf door which opens outwards. This door leads into the entrance hall, which is level and has flagstone flooring. There is seating in the corridor and two rubber-backed welcome mats on the floor. The payphone/emergency contact phone is located here.

There is then a set of double doors into the main hallway with the same flooring, followed by a single leaf door and a ramp up into the reception area. The flooring on the ramp and in the reception area is tile. The area is well-lit with ceiling lights. A portable induction loop is available on request at reception.

Public areas

Halls and corridors

There is good colour contrast to floor, walls and doorways throughout the building. All public areas, halls, stairs and landings are well lit using a combination of ceiling and wall lights. The corridor flooring is a mixture of flagstones, tile and lino on the ground floor. On the upper floors the flooring is lino. There is level access to all public facilities on the ground floor.

We do not have a lift so access to the upper floors is by stairs only. The stairs have non-slip contrasting nosing. There is a banister fitted to one side. There are 15 steps to the first floor and then another 13 steps up to the second floor.

Lounge

Our lounge is located on the ground floor and there is a single-leaf door to enter from the entrance hall. The floor is level and surfaced with carpet. The room is well-lit with ceiling lights and furnished with sofas, coffee tables, dining tables and straight-backed chairs without armrests. All furniture can be moved – please ask at reception if you need assistance.

Dining room

The dining room is located on the ground floor opposite the self-catering kitchen and has a single-leaf door from the main hallway. The floor is level and surfaced with lino, and the room is evenly lit with ceiling lights. There are dining tables and benches and chairs without armrests. All furniture can be moved – please ask at reception if you need assistance.

Table service is available (please ask at reception). We are happy to cater for dietary requirements or any likes or dislikes – please advise us of these before arrival.

Self-catering kitchen

The self-catering kitchen is located on the ground floor opposite the dining room and has a single-leaf door from the main hallway. The floor is level and surfaced with quarry tile. The room is well-lit.

The kitchen is equipped with 2 cookers (oven, grill and 4 hobs on each), large fridge-freezer, microwave, continuous hot water boiler and full range of kitchen utensils, crockery and cutlery. Crockery and some kitchen equipment are kept in high shelving units. We would be happy to move these to lower storage if required.

Drying facilities

The drying room is located on the ground floor with level access from reception via a single leaf door. The floor is level and surfaced with quarry tile. The room is spacious and has plenty of drying racks and rails, but no washing machine.

Bedrooms and bathrooms

Unless otherwise stated, all bedrooms have bunk beds. All bedrooms are carpeted (except room 1 on the first floor which is fitted with lino) and well-lit with ceiling lights. Some rooms include a wash basin. All bedding is provided.

All bathrooms have fluorescent lighting and non-slip flooring. Showers have a step up to enter.

First floor

- One room that sleeps 1 person. It includes a single bed.
- One room that sleeps up to 2 people. It includes two single beds.
- One en-suite room that sleeps up to 4 people. It includes 2 sets of bunk beds.
- Four rooms that sleep up to 4 people each. They include 2 sets of bunk beds.
- One room that sleeps up to 6 people. It includes 3 sets of bunk beds.
- Communal bathroom with 2 showers and 2 WCs.
- Two communal showers.
- Three communal WCs.

Second floor

- One room that sleeps up to 2 people. It includes 2 single beds.
- One room that sleeps up to 2 people. It includes a set of bunk beds.
- One room that sleeps up to 4 people. It includes a sets of bunk beds and 2 single beds.
- One room that sleeps up to 6 people. It includes 3 sets of bunk beds.
- One room that sleeps up to 7 people. It includes 3 sets of bunk beds and a single bed.
- Communal bathroom with 2 showers and a WC.

Grounds and garden

We have partly wooded grounds opposite the hostel, leading down to the lake shore of Llyn Cwellyn. There is a sloping gravel path part-way down, which becomes a grass path that can be very muddy and boggy.

The grounds are wild and open to the public, so supervision of children is recommended. A map of the grounds is available at reception.

Cycle store

We have a lean-to shelter at the rear of the main building, accessed along a level passageway to the right-hand side of the building (minimum width is 85cm).

Additional information

- Pets are not permitted at YHA Snowdon Ranger except when hiring the whole hostel through YHA Exclusive Hire, though assistance dogs are welcome throughout – please notify us at the time of booking.
- Smoking is not permitted anywhere in the hostel.

- A member of staff is not always available on site. However, YHA staff can be contacted 24-hours-a-day via the emergency phone in the entrance hall.
- Emergency lighting and fire alarms are fitted. Guests are responsible for their own evacuation in the event of a fire or similar emergency. Arrangements for guests needing assistance to evacuate should be discussed at check-in.
- Evacuation procedures are displayed in each bedroom.
- Mobile phone reception is poor within the hostel and immediate vicinity.
- Wi-Fi is not available at this hostel.
