

YHA Whitby – Access Statement

Introduction

If you're looking for a cheap seaside break or school trip, YHA Whitby is ideal accommodation. The hostel is an exceptional building, parts of which date back to the 12th century, which is situated high on Whitby's east cliff overlooking the town. We are right next to the famous ruined Abbey and close to all the curious and quirky attractions that Whitby has to offer.

We aim to cater for the needs of all visitors in this three-storey building, located on the Yorkshire coast. We do not have any ground floor rooms, but our lift provides access to the upper floors. We have one accessible bedroom with an accessible ensuite bathroom on the first floor.

Pre-arrival

- The nearest rail station is Whitby, 0.5 miles away (1.5 miles by car).
- There is no public transport from Whitby town centre to the hostel, though open-top tour buses operate in the summer months.
- A local taxi company can provide accessible taxis when booked in advance.
- The shortest route from the town centre is walking Whitby's iconic 199 steps. These are stone with handrails on both sides and benches at some intervals.
- Alternatively, there is road access via Abbey Lane (from the direction of Scarborough) and Green Lane (access from the North York Moors and Teesside). There is no pavement on Abbey Lane until the Abbey, where an even raised pavement follows the perimeter wall round to the turning area. Green Lane is very steep in places with an even pavement to one side.

Car parking and arrival

We have limited onsite parking outside the main entrance. There are two marked accessible parking bays – that we are happy to reserve if required – and a drop-off point. There is further pay and display parking 5 minutes away (charges apply during the summer months).

There is an even surface, either paved or packed gravel, leading from the car park to the hostel entrance. The car park is lit but lighting in Whitby and on the headland is at a low level, so torches are recommended. If you let us know what time you are coming, we will do our best to assist with moving to and from cars.

Main entrance and reception

To enter the hostel there is a manual, wooden, single leaf door which opens inwards. There is a small wooden step up (approximately 4cm).

The reception is on the ground floor and is level throughout, with large spaces for a wheelchair user to manoeuvre. The flooring is carpet and the area is well-lit with ceiling lights. The reception desk has a low-level service section and there is a two-seater sofa for guests to use. There is also an emergency phone number displayed to contact to a member of staff at night if they are not on reception.

Public areas

Halls, corridors and lifts

There is good colour contrast to floor, walls and doorways throughout the building. All public areas, halls, stairs, landings and lifts are well-lit using a combination of ceiling and wall lights. The flooring is mostly carpet but non-slip vinyl in some places.

We have a lift which serves all floors except the mezzanine. There is also access to upper floors via stairs. The stairs are carpeted and have handrails on both sides.

WCs

We have two accessible WCs at YHA Whitby. One is close to reception and the other is close to the dining room. Both contain grab rails, low wash basins fitted with lever taps and emergency cords. Both have left-handed transfer onto the toilet.

Lounge

The lounge is located on the ground floor with level access from reception via a single leaf door. The floor is level and covered with carpet. The room is well-lit with ceiling lights. There are sofas, armchairs and coffee tables. All furniture can be moved – please ask at reception if you need assistance.

From here there is also level access to the conservatory. This offers views of the gardens and is furnished with tables and straight-backed chairs without armrests.

Dining room

The dining room is located on the ground floor. There are 8 steps down to this room from the reception; however, we have a stair lift with roll on platform available if needed. From the bottom of the steps there is level access to the dining room.

The floor is level and surfaced with non-slip vinyl. There are tables and straight-backed chairs without armrests. All furniture can be moved – please ask at reception if you need assistance.

Table service is available (ask at reception). We are also happy to cater for dietary requirements or any likes or dislikes – please advise us of these before your arrival.

Self-catering kitchen and dining area

The self-catering kitchen is located on the ground floor and is also accessible via the stair lift. There is level access from here. The kitchen floor is level and surfaced with non-slip lino.

The kitchen sinks are fitted with lever taps and there is a low-level work surface with a microwave, cordless kettle and storage racks. There are 2 electric cookers and a 4-ring hob. Crockery and some kitchen equipment are kept in high shelving units. We are happy to move these to lower storage if required.

The self-catering dining room is next door. It also has non-slip lino flooring and is well-lit. There are tables and straight-backed chairs without armrests. All furniture can be moved.

Meeting room

Our meeting room is located on the ground floor and has level access from the reception via a single leaf door. We have tables and straight-backed chairs without armrests which we can provide in a variety of seating arrangements.

The floor here is level and surfaced with polished wood. The room is well-lit by ceiling lights. Please contact the hostel directly for further enquiries.

Bedrooms and bathrooms

Unless otherwise stated, all bedrooms have bunk beds. Most of our rooms are ensuite and, if not, include a wash basin. Our bedrooms are carpeted and well-lit with ceiling and individual bunk lights. All bedding is provided.

All bathrooms have fluorescent lighting and non-slip flooring. Showers have a step up to enter.

First floor

Access to this floor is by lift or a set of 23 steps (main staircase) or 21 steps (back staircase). There are also 5 steps up along the corridor.

- One room that sleeps up to 2 people. It includes a set of bunk beds.
- One en-suite room that sleeps up to 4 people. It includes 2 sets of bunk beds.
- One room that sleeps up to 4 people. It includes 2 sets of bunk beds.
- One accessible en-suite room that sleeps up to 5 people. It includes a single high-sleeper bunk with a double bed underneath and a set of bunk beds. The en-suite bathroom is fitted with grab rails, emergency cord, wheel-in shower and folding shower seat. Transfer onto the toilet is right-handed. An evacuation chair is located outside the room.
- One en-suite room that sleeps up to 5 people. It includes a set of bunk beds and a single bed.
- Two en-suite rooms that sleeps up to 6 people each. They include 3 sets of bunk beds. One of the en-suite bathrooms is fitted with a shower over a bath.
- Two en-suite rooms that sleep up to 8 people each. They include 4 sets of bunk beds.

Communal WC and a shower over a bath.

Second floor

Access to this floor is by lift or a set of 41 steps (back staircase).

- One en-suite room that sleeps up to 3 people. It includes a set of bunk beds and a single bed.
- Two en-suite rooms that sleep up to 4 people each. They include a double bed and a set of bunk beds.
- Three en-suite rooms that sleep up to 4 people each. They include 2 sets of bunk beds or a set of bunk beds and 2 single beds.
- Two en-suite rooms that sleep up to 6 people each. They include 3 sets of bunk beds.
- One en-suite room that sleeps up to 8 people. It includes 4 sets of bunk beds.

Mezzanine floor

Access to the lower mezzanine is only by a set of 16 steps.

- One en-suite room that sleeps up to 2 people. It includes a set of bunk beds. There is a step into the room from the corridor.
- One en-suite room that sleeps up to 6 people. It includes 3 sets of bunk beds.
- One en-suite room that sleeps up to 7 people. It includes a double bed, 2 sets
 of bunk beds and a single bed. There is a step into the room from the corridor
 and the en-suite bathroom is fitted with a shower over a bath.
- One en-suite room that sleeps up to 10 people. It includes 5 sets of bunk beds.

There are 15 steps up from the lower mezzanine to the upper mezzanine. These bedrooms can also be accessed via the first floor.

- Two en-suite rooms that sleep up to 4 people each. They include 2 sets of bunk beds.
- One en-suite room that sleeps up to 6 people. It includes 3 sets of bunk beds. There are two steps into the room from the corridor.
- One room that sleeps up to 8 people. It includes 4 sets of bunk beds. There are 14 steps up to this room from the upper mezzanine. It is fitted with an ensuite toilet (a shower can be accessed from the corridor outside the room).

Grounds and garden

The garden can be accessed via a ramp from the courtyard or the lounge. We have a large lawn and historic herb garden with plant information. The garden is mostly level and paths around it are wide and surfaced with either paving slabs or gravel.

Cycle store

The cycle shed is at the end of the drying yard behind the tearoom. There is level access from the tearoom garden.

Camping & Cabins accommodation

In the summer months, bell tents are available in the hostel grounds. Access to the camping area is via two sets of steps, each with six or seven steps.

Our premium bell tents each sleep up to 5 people. They include a double bed, two single beds and a single futon that can be folded into a chair. Bedding is provided. Each tent is fitted with solar lighting and bean bags, plus rugs and a wooden storage trunk that doubles up as a coffee table.

In the winter months, our self-contained studio room is available in a separate chalet building away from the main hostel. Access to this building is via an uneven cobbled path and through a gateway (secure keycard access) with two steps up.

The studio room has a private entrance door (combination lock) with a step up. Once inside, the flooring is flat and on one level. The room has a double bed, three single beds, a kitchenette, dining table, seating and lounge area. There are two private showers and toilets nearby, though these are not accessible. Guests also have access to an enclosed garden.

Additional information

- A secure key card system is in operation for 24-hour access.
- Pets are not permitted at YHA Whitby, though assistance dogs are welcome throughout – please notify us at the time of booking.
- Smoking is not permitted anywhere in the hostel.
- A member of staff is always available including at night. If they are not on reception, they can be contacted via the emergency phone number.
- Emergency lighting and fire alarms are fitted. We ensure that all guests are evacuated in the event of fire or a similar emergency. Arrangements for guests needing assistance to evacuate should be discussed beforehand.
- Evacuation procedures are displayed in each bedroom.
- Mobile phone reception within the hostel is good.
- Wi-Fi is available on the ground floor near reception and in the café bar.
